COMING EVENTS.

August 6th
Point Lillias.

If we meet at <u>Chirnside Park</u> 9.30am we can car pool then travel down the Highway and take the <u>Avalon Beach Rd.</u>, drive slowly when you reach the Salt Works as it is possible there will be Banded stilts and Spoonbills in on the left. Proceed to the end and turn left. There is a toilet block there. Continue to the end of the road and then we will walk along the track to go out on to <u>Pt. Lillias</u>. There is little shelter so rug up well.

After our visit to the point we will return to the cars and enter the <u>Avalon Convention Centre</u>,. We have obtained permission from Geelong Grammar to use the lawn area for lunch, we can take the short walk to the beach.

Return along Avalon Rd., right into <u>Dandos Rd.</u>, past Avalon Airport, into <u>Pousties Rd.</u>, then <u>Beach rd.</u>, and along to <u>Kirk's Point.</u> You should see some Black shouldered kite along the road as well as many other birds. The total trip from Werribee to Werribee is about 65k. Not sure where we will take bird call.
